## Birding in Barranquilla

Start your adventure with a visit to the Ciénaga de Mallorquín, an expansive wetland ecosystem renowned for its rich biodiversity within the city of Barranquilla! With over 160 bird species registered in this area, you'll explore tropical trails and spot a variety of local species. After a refreshing lunch back at the hotel, the afternoon offers a cultural tour of Barranquilla's highlights, including the Malecón and the colorful Ventana al Mundo. Return to Buró 51 in the evening to unwind and relax, preparing for the next day's adventures.

## From sea to the mountain

Barranquilla to the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta

Start your day early as you depart from Buró 51, heading toward the lush mountains of Minca. En route, you'll pass through the protected area Vía Parque Isla Salamanca, a unique ecosystem of mangroves and wetlands. This rich environment is home to a variety of intriguing bird species, enjoy the opportunity to witness them in their natural habitat before continuing your journey to Minca. Keep your binoculars ready for birdwatching stops along the way, with the Ramsar site Ciénaga Grande de Santa Marta and the Caribbean coastline providing stunning views and excellent birding opportunities.

Finish the day at El Dorado reserve with amazing views.

## Sunrise at Cerro Kennedy

and explore Sierra Nevada lush forests

Your day begins with a pre-dawn departure from El Dorado, heading straight to the summit of Cerro Kennedy. Though it's still dark as you ascend, the reward is well worth it—arriving at the peak just in time to witness one of the most breathtaking sunrises in Colombia. From this vantage point, you'll enjoy panoramic views that stretch from the Caribbean Sea to the snow-capped peaks of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, creating an unforgettable moment.

## Last day in the Sierra Nevada

and Tayrona Beach escap

Start the day with a relaxed birdwatching session along the scenic trails of El Dorado Reserve, where the morning light brings the forest to life. This final opportunity to explore the reserve's unique ecosystems is perfect for spotting more of the region's rare species while enjoying the tranquil beauty of the Sierra Nevada.

After a light snack back at the lodge, it's time to check out and begin the journey towards the coast. A scenic drive will take you from the cool mountain air down to the Tayrona National Park, where you can unwind on the pristine beaches, soaking in the Caribbean sun and refreshing yourself by the sea.

## Birdwatching at the Flamingos' sanctuary

DAY 5

Begin your final day with an early morning transfer from Casa del Mar in Riohacha to the Santuario de Fauna y Flora Los Flamencos, a protected area celebrated for its diverse birdlife and rich coastal lagoons. Here, you'll embark on a rewarding birdwatching adventure with a special focus on spotting the graceful American Flamingo. The sanctuary is renowned for its rich variety of shorebirds and migratory birds, including plovers, sandpipers, and oystercatchers. The serene waters and striking landscapes provide perfect conditions for photography and immersive nature experiences.

## Recommendations

To fully enjoy this journey, we recommend bringing lightweight, breathable clothing suitable for warm and tropical climates and sturdy walking shoes for nature trails. Colombia's weather can be quite diverse, with extremely hot temperatures along the coast, so it's important to stay hydrated and use sun protection. In contrast, the mountains of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta can be much cooler, especially in the evenings, so pack a warm layer for your time in the higher elevations.

Don't forget your binoculars and camera to capture the extraordinary birdlife and scenic landscapes. A good field guide on Colombia's bird species is also a great companion for a deeper appreciation of the unique birds you'll encounter along the way.

The trip covers a wide range of ecosystems, starting with the coastal wetlands and mangroves of Ciénaga de Mallorquín and Vía Parque Isla Salamanca, both offering prime habitats for shorebirds, wading birds, and migratory species. At Santuario de Fauna y Flora Los Flamencos (SFF Los Flamencos), you'll explore coastal lagoons and dry tropical forests, home to flamingos, shorebirds, and unique desert-adapted species like the Vermilion Cardinal.


As the tour progresses, you'll ascend into the tropical dry forests around Minca, where you can observe a blend of lowland and montane bird species. In the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, you'll explore lush cloud forests, which harbor many of Colombia's endemic bird species.

If you decide to extend your journey, the final days take you to the high-altitude paramo and montane forests of the Serranía del Perijá, a region known for its unique birdlife and astonishing landscapes. These varied habitats offer a rich diversity of birdwatching opportunities across the trip.



## Weather conditions

The tour spans a variety of climates, starting with hot and humid conditions at coastal locations like Barranquilla and Vía Parque Isla Salamanca. As you move inland and ascend into the Sierra Nevada and Perijá mountains, temperatures become cooler, especially at higher altitudes. Expect mild, cool mornings and potentially chilly evenings, particularly in cloud forest areas like El Dorado Reserve and Cerro Kennedy.





## **Tour Pace and Walking**

This tour follows a moderate pace, combining structured birding excursions with time for rest and exploration. Daily walks on forest trails are required, some of which may be uneven or mildly strenuous, particularly at higher altitudes. However, there will be frequent stops to enjoy bird sightings and the scenery. Most days will feature morning and afternoon birding sessions, with breaks for meals and optional evening excursions.



## **Ease of Birding**

While the tour offers access to rich birding environments, the ease of birding varies by location. Coastal and wetland birding (e.g., Los Flamencos and Isla Salamanca) provides relatively easy access and clear sightlines, while forested areas like El Dorado and Perijá may require more patience to spot elusive species. The diverse ecosystems increase the chances of excellent sightings, though forest birding often requires more attention to movement and sound.



## **Number of Species Expected**

Throughout the tour, you can expect to encounter between 250 and 300 species of birds, including a significant number of endemic species. The Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta and Perijá mountains, in particular, are home to a rich variety of species found nowhere else in the world. In addition to the many tropical species, you'll also spot a variety of shorebirds, migratory species, and forest specialists.
